



The village of Kongasis with its 500 families, and its school, providing a basic education to almost 200 students, is fortunate.



They **have water**, a reliable spring, adequate for their needs.
*That's the **good** news.*



The **bad** news follows. The retention pond, from which water is collected, is contained by a 50-year-old concrete block dam that **leaks**.

Furthermore, the pond lacks adequate barriers to keep animals out to **prevent pollution**.



There is a proposal to remedy the problem. The estimated total cost is approximately \$16,500.

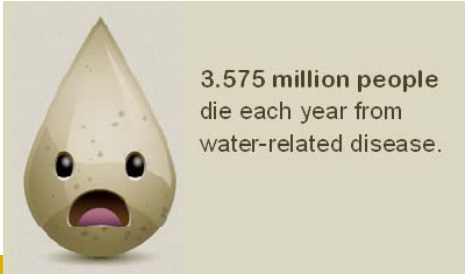

Did you Know.....
 It's an unfortunate paradox that water – a substance so vital for survival – is also responsible for disease and death. The fact is that waterborne disease kills more people – everyday – than armed conflict, HIV/AIDS and cancer....combined.

Did you Know.....
 In the developing world, the burden of collecting water falls specifically on women and children. The work is grueling and without reward. On average, women walk 6.5 miles to a water source.

Did you Know.....
 Did you know that over 60% of the 113 million children NOT enrolled in school are GIRLS. Of the 113 million children currently not enrolled in school worldwide, 60% are girls. This is due largely to the fact that young girls are needed to help collect the family's water supply.

 If we did nothing other than provide access to clean water, without any other medical intervention, we could save 2 million lives a year.
