Webster lists two definitions for gifts as: 1. a notable capacity or talent. 2. something transferred by one person to another without compensation.

There are at least 43 verses in the Bible regarding gifts and talents.

Most well know are **James 1:17**: Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of heavenly lights.

1Corinthians 12: 4: Now there are diversities of gifts but the same spirit that gives them.

Romans 12:6-8: 6. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy. 7. Or ministry, let us wait on out ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching. 8. Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, let him do it with simplicity, he that ruleth, with diligence; he that seweth mercy, with cheerfulness.

Anti-hunger advocates say cuts to SNAP benefits passed as part of the 2023 Omnibus spending bill will hasten an imminent hunger cliff for millions of program participants. The cuts come, according to FRAC SNAP Director Ellen Vollinger, “at a time when we’re hearing, anecdotally, from emergency food providers around the country [about] how tough it is for them to keep up with the demand that they’re seeing, even toward the end of 2022.”
