Change...

Is there change in your world as you enter 2023?

The nature of life is always changing. Just when you think you have learned the way to live, life changes. Our bodies evolve so significantly throughout our lives. Our minds and attitudes also change along with our bodies. A dear friend recently quoted her mother who chimed, "Getting old is not for sissy's". Is this a statement that there are more yesterdays than tomorrows? Is it a statement that there are struggles? Absolutely.

We all react differently to change. Events of change can often bring about stress and worry about what comes next. Some resign themselves to it. They don't resist it, but don't accept it either. The change doesn't change them, it merely changes their circumstances. Others fight change, any kind of change. This is how some folks cope with change. They resist it. Sometimes we do have to resist change because the change is a bad one. But some people resist change because they are against any change at all. These folks need to give themselves and their world grace. Grace to continue on in life.

It is important to learn how to maintain an inner peace and tranquility to ride through the waves of difficulty with ease. How is this done?

In Bob Dylan's iconic ballad, "These Times They Are A Change-in" of 1963 was intended to be a political and social statement of change. Dylan recalled writing the song as a deliberate attempt to create an anthem of change for the moment in time. The civil rights movement and the folk music movement were pretty close for a while and allied together at that time.

The climactic lines of the final verse: "The order is rapidly fadin'/ And the first one now/ Will later be last/ For the times they are a-changin" have a Biblical ring, and several critics have connected them with lines in the **Gospel of Mark, 10:31, 'But many that are first shall be last, and the last first.'**

What does the Bible say about change and how can it inspire us in times of change? There seems to always be a guarantee in life that change will happen. Change is something we tend to fear and become anxious about because we do not feel in control of life. The good news is that God has a plan for your life that includes hope, future, and prosperity. We need to learn to trust in God and allow the change to grow us to become more like Jesus Christ.

Our faith also is ever changing. Faith in God is questioned, challenged and accepted at different times in our lives. Perhaps we even talk to God for guidance. Perhaps we lift up our concerns for ourselves and others to God to own, especially when they are too heavy for us to carry. Are we open to hearing the quiet responses that God offers to us? Having purpose filled trust that God is with us is a great way to enter into 2023.

When life changes to be harder, change yourself to be stronger. Find your strength through God's grace. This year, make positive changes that honor God.

Women's Circle - In a snapshot...





Here is what is coming up in the next few months for our Women's Circle.

You'll be hearing more about what solution we decide to try, but rest assured, the Food Cupboard is and will continue to serve the hungry in Palmyra. So, keep filling it up and let your friends know they can fill it too.



There was a toddler activity seat left near the Food Cupboard. It was taken to Good Will so it can be used by another family. If you see something there that is cluttering the space, feel free to throw it away or take it where it can be used. People are leaving things because they "take the food," but never have any food to leave in the cupboard, so they leave what they can, books, clothes, crayons...



To keep the squirrels out of the cupboard, the left-side door is hooked at the top and the bottom and when closed, the right-side door when closed can be secured to the left-side door. Hopefully it will keep those little varmints on the outside.

Rev. Carol May Wilson



CANANDAIGUA – Rev. Carol May Wilson, age 80, passed away unexpectedly at home, on Wednesday (December 14, 2022).

Born December 25, 1941, her cry was the first Christmas Carol that her mother heard. After graduating high school in Auburn, Mass., Carol began her lifelong love of higher education. She earned a bachelor's degree from Illinois College in 1963, and later a master's degree in philosophy from the University of Hawaii. Carol studied in an Ashram in India for three years. In 1970, Carol earned her second master's degree in philosophy at the University of Calgary, where she made lifelong friends.

Carol's life of service then began. Moving to upstate New York, she worked with Wayne County Action Program, fighting to improve the living conditions of migrant workers. She then managed the Wayne County branch of Rochester Area Multiple Sclerosis and forged relationships that lasted the rest of her life. After surviving breast cancer, Carol, with the generous sponsorship of the Lyons Presbyterian Church, returned to education and attended Colgate Crozer Divinity School, where she earned her third master's degree.

Her work as a minister exemplified Carol's commitment to service and love. She spent time as a hospital chaplain, then took an interim position at the Camden, N.Y. Presbyterian Church. On April 13, 2004, she answered the greatest call of her life and was ordained as the minister at Charlotte Valley Presbyterian Church. She was surrounded by love, faith, and worship. After retiring in 2017, Carol preached at churches in Phelps, Pulteney and Hammondsport, among others. She was very active in the Presbytery, worked elections and volunteered to teach literacy. Carol lived a life of service and love. We were blessed by her presence, and she will be missed so very much.

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Matthew, and Katherine McCrossen; three grandchildren, Amelia, Fletcher, and Archer; two brothers, Jim (Barbara) Wilson and Carl (Anita) Wilson.

A Celebration of Life will be held Wednesday (December 21) at 1 p.m., at Lyons Presbyterian Church, 11 Queen St., Lyons. A reception will follow from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. at the Lyons VFW, 202 Geneva St., Lyons.

Donations to Mission Projects – The checks approved in September have still not been received by the Team. Irene will again request the checks be written.

(12-16-22 update Checks have been received)

Family Promise – 2022 donation for \$377 was approved.

Healthy Ninos in Honduras – November Shoe Collection 4 boxes packed and probably 3 more to be boxed. No count was made, but it was an overwhelming success. A sincere thank you will be given to the congregation in the next Spire.

Food Pantry update – Everything is going along well. Christmas boxes being given out Dec. 17th. Too much help at Thanksgiving, so Ruth didn't think anyone was needed for Christmas packing.

Food Cupboard "Take what you need, Give what you can." – The doors have been additionally fastened to try to keep squirrels out. The left-hand door can be locked at the bottom and top and there are two hasps and one hook to close the right-hand door securely to the left. Edie will let Palmyra Neighbors know the locks have been added to prevent the squirrels from getting in. *As squirrel proof bird feeders do not work so well, we expect the squirrels will be clever enough to get into the cupboard, but we're trying.* Thanks to all who have filled the cupboard.

Good Neighbor Fund Update – approved putting the \$115 that was given for fire victims in the general fund. Approved raising the minimum check per family to \$800.
