

WESTERN SPIRE MAY 2024

As many of you know by now, I have had tooth pain for the last two months, which prevented me from biting down on one side and chewing any hard food (even rice or noodle) with it. The source of pain was a cracked tooth followed by gum swelling. It took me an hour to finish the meal with the discomfort and sudden sharp pain when I accidentally chewed on the problematic side without knowing a small piece of food was sitting on the tooth. I know I shouldn't exaggerate my pain because it took only two visits to the dentist's office and one more visit in May for the tooth pain to be gone.

Normally, we do not think of the locations of our body parts, nor can we feel our organs inside our body except when they are in pain or trouble. For example, many young people do not know which one is closer to the neck between stomach, liver, and kidney because they don't know to know it. But when you can't put your luggage in an overhead bin on a plane because of your shoulder pain, you get to learn that the mechanism of shoulder movement involves four joints working together. Or, what we simply call 'abdominal pain' for pain anywhere between our chest and groin may be caused by either cholecystitis or diverticulitis, depending on the exact location of the pain.

Even though it is such a blessing for people not to have to comprehend their body parts and their mechanism because their bodily functions are functioning properly, it does not necessarily mean they reach a point of their physical, mental, and emotional wellbeing. They may be satisfied with a physical state without complaints, symptoms of disease, or serous pain, but they can't ignore the fact that our wellbeing is more than functioning properly. A lot of times their version of feeling good is no more than not feeling unwell. After all, it is not just money and physical condition that are important in our lives, but purposes, goals, friendships, and a sense of belonging are also equally important in life.

Jesus shocked and offended many Pharisees as he said to them, "For judgment I came into this world, so that those who do not see may see, and that those who see may become blind," to which the Pharisees responded, "We are not blind too, are we?" Jesus answered them back, "If you were blind, you would have no sin. But since you say, 'we see,' your sin remains," which means to say, "Yes, you guys are blind." (John 9:39~41)

Here, Jesus obviously was talking about their misconception that their functioning as religious leaders in the society represented their spiritual wellbeing. Even when their personality, relationships, attitudes toward others, and integrity were broken and distorted, they didn't realize the spiritual cost of their hardened hearts. Again, their version of feeling good about themselves was no more than not feeling unwell in spirituality.

In case we don't understand his point, the Gospel of John ends with three questions of Jesus to Peter who failed to follow him to the cross and failed to embrace Jesus' resurrection. These are the questions to ask ourselves when we feel a lack of direction and purpose in our lives. These are the questions to ask ourselves to measure the purposefulness and determinedness of our spiritual life. Finally, these questions help us take our grip on Jesus, whenever we confuse not feeling unwell spiritually with our faithfulness before God. The questions Jesus keeps asking us are, "Do you love me more than these things? Do you love me? Do you love me?" If we answer these questions honestly, Jesus tells us what to do after that, "Feed my sheep."



Opening Prayer

Food Pantry update – There is always a need for household products. One day 28 families. Other days, not as many. Food Pantry quarterly meeting was changed to later in the month and so Ruth does not have a balance. At the April Foodlink Conference, notice was given of some procedures that are changing. At the conference, Don was recognized for his service to the Pal-Mac Food Pantry.

Food Cupboard "Take what you need, Give what you can." The Lions Club is going to do a project on April 27th to collect food items from the Pal-Mac community that will be stored in the church and for use in the Food Cupboard. This is a project that may be done a couple of times a year.

Good Neighbor Fund Update – Balance remains at remains at \$251.07. Check from Rotary was received for \$1,000. Mission Team has also given \$1,000 which should be available to the GNF. (Val and Irene have been away. It will be received by the GNF soon.)

Sally will contact John Cook to find out if families, asking for help from the GNF, are contacting Social Services to receive help from programs provided. Cassie pointed out that Social Services have requirements that are not always productive for helping families.

Weekend Wellness update – There is a remaining balance in the Weekend Wellness account of \$2,000. Ruth will let the Food Pantry Board that amount is available. So far this school year, 2,500 bags have been received by the children in the Pal-Mac schools.

"Sharing is Caring" Lenten calendar – Love Loaf Banks amount received \$378. It will be given to the Presbytery Hunger Fund which is used for food pantries within the Presbytery.

Mission and Witness Grants – Session has approved and our application for \$3,000 was sent in for the Good Neighbor Fund. The due date is April 18th so we should be hearing in the next few weeks.

Family Promise – Ruth and Sally served dinner in March. They totally enjoyed the experience. We are hosting Family Promise the week of April 22. Jan is getting dessert and Irene and Peter will take care of the meal. There are two families, one parent and 2 children each. Family Promise is hoping the Village of Lyons will allow two families to live in the Day Resource Center so 3 families can benefit from Family Promise. Sally commented that Family Promise is a wonderful program because the families get individualized help. All families that were part of Family Promise are still in secure housing. WPC Summer Family Promise dinners are July 22nd and July 29th.

Presbyterian Women are encouraged to collect hygiene kits for Church World Service to give to families who are in need after natural disasters, like a tornado or flood. 16 bags were turned in at the Women's Circle Gathering. An email was sent out to members that bags can be returned by Sunday, April 21st. They are being collected in Canandaigua on the 22nd.

Meetings of the Mission Team will be the first Thursday of each month. The next meeting will be on May 2nd at 10 AM.


