Our oversight alternates between short-term and long-term needs. Tactically, we manage routine maintenance and repairs. Strategically, we consider the replacement and upgrading of systems as an investment for greater cost effectiveness, capacity, performance, or lifespan.

We are grateful to Dave Pinkney for his many years of service as a member of the Property Team and his willingness to continue to support us as he steps away from full time membership on the team.

We are also grateful to many in the congregation who are our eyes and ears and help us keep the church building and grounds in good working order.

Significant Activities and Notes

We are preparing for the quoting process to have the steeple repainted in 2022.

Starting the process of changing fluorescent bulbs to LED versions throughout the church, starting in the lower hallway and as other fixtures fail. Expecting cost savings in both energy usage and maintenance costs as all 302 bulbs are converted.

Continue to work on landscaping and are adding some pieces of slate to provide a path thru the flowerbed to the "Winston Churchill" plaque on the front of the church.

Thank you to John S. Blazey, Inc. for the use of the boom lift so the gutters could be cleaned, inspected, and repaired this year.

A portion of a wall between 2 classrooms upstairs has been removed to provide one larger classroom for CTNS. Wall opening has been sized to allow for the option of a "door" to temporarily separate the spaces again if needed for Family Promise or other users.

We are investigating options to change the 9 thermostats that are within the church. We have experienced intermittent issues on multiple units, so believe it is time to change all of them.

We have been blessed to have Larry Sprague as our custodian, but his time with us will soon come to an end. We are starting to search for another custodian or local cleaning service.

Continuing to train people on how to use the AV system for recording and streaming Sunday services and adding some multimedia to the worship service. We welcome additional volunteers that would like to be trained to run the system.

The Nursery School wrapped up the unusual 2020-2021 school year with a fun graduation ceremony held in the sanctuary of the church. We had a great turnout and even surprised the families by having the kids wear fun duck-billed shaped face masks. A safe and successful school year lead into a delightfully busy summer as we rolled out our brand-new summer camp! The camp was held during 2 weeks in July and was led by Stacey Denniston as Camp Director and Lisa Perry as Camp Counselor. Some school-aged Junior counselors rounded out the group and we had guest appearances by Phil Opdycke, who led some really fascinating nature walks, and Joe Perry who did some really cool science demonstrations. The camp got rave reviews from campers and parents alike.

Some exciting changes also happened over the summer to our Muscle Room. A local Scout, Chloe Kessler, chose to remodel the muscle room for her Eagle project. She worked to gather donations and funding and assembled a team to clean, decorate, re-paint, and re-carpet the space. The result is a new, fun space that is much brighter, cleaner, and more welcoming than before. The Nursery School kiddos give it two thumbs up!

Another big project that was completed over the summer was the removal of a wall in between two of the classrooms. This allowed CTNS to accommodate a larger class size, increase room flexibility, and improve air flow/circulation.

We have two students enrolled in our newly formalized Before School Care program. This allows families who have work constraints to drop their children off a half hour prior to the start of the school day. The families utilizing this service are very happy with this offering because it makes a smoother home to school transition for their children.

The school year started a bit later this year for CTNS, mid- September, and the kids and staff are happy to be back. We had a successful school picture day already and have even more fun ideas in the works. It's going to be a great year!

Mexico Water Project – We will contribute \$250 to Cassie’s expenditures for the mission trip. Money will come from the mug fund.

Cupboard “Take what you need, Give what you can.”

The cupboard has been given the green light by the code enforcement officer.

The same man who built the cabinet in Macedon is eager to build one for Palmyra with no cost to us. When it is completed, he will install it on church property facing Rte. 31. The Property Team has been asked to select the location.

Mission Team is looking for a storage cabinet to store additional donated items.

Edie will write an article for the Spire about the cupboard. She spoke with the person who does the cupboard in Macedon and received a lot of tips they have learned in Macedon. We hope several people at WPC and the Palmyra Community check it daily. Information in the cupboard will list pantries hours it is open and possibly the Episcopal church’s phone number.

Food Pantry update

The past couple of weeks the food pantry has served up to 12 families in one evening. Families can now come to the pantry 2 times a month. Cereal is again needed. Food link brought only individual servings of cereal. The floor was very dirty, and Larry cleaned it. Only 3 birthday bags remain. Typically, Women’s Circle brings in birthday bags, but circle is not meeting in October so pantry may (will) need more bags by the 3rd week in November.

Community Garden update

Ruth will send letter to Phil and the Trues with lots of thank you’s for service they provided to the Food Pantry. Phil has cleaned the garden up and it is ready for winter. Too many

tomatoes were planted this year. Beans, peppers, cucumbers, and cherry tomatoes were appreciated by the families at the food pantry. No decisions have been made on the garden for next year. Rena shared that she will not be doing a garden next year.

Families are not asked if they have had a vaccination, so volunteers will need to make a decision if they want to go to the day center.

WPC agreed to host 4 weeks each calendar year. I have signed up for January 2 and June 5. We will sign up for 2 more weeks in 2022. Macedon Baptist may do their own week – They did do one this past summer.

At the Coordinator's meeting, they liked the idea of Birthday Bags for the children. The bags will be brought to the day center and passed out by Family Promise Staff.


