#### Nutrition Leaders Introduce Comprehensive Proposal to Address and Prevent Child Hunger

**WASHINGTON** – Today (7-20-22), Chairman Robert C. "Bobby" Scott (VA-03) and Civil Rights and Human Services Subcommittee Chair Suzanne Bonamici (OR-01) introduced a comprehensive, evidence-driven reauthorization of federal child nutrition programs that meets the needs of children and families.

The *Healthy Meals, Healthy Kids Act* (H.R. 8450) builds on **work** to expand school and summer meal programs, increase access to federal nutrition programs like the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), and prevent child hunger.

"One of the key lessons reaffirmed by our response to the COVID-19 pandemic is that, when we invest in child nutrition programs, we help reduce child hunger.... We know we have more work ahead to achieve our ultimate goal—eliminating child hunger in America. The Healthy Meals, Healthy Kids Act takes long overdue steps to deliver on that goal by modernizing proven child nutrition programs and providing more children and families with access to nutrition assistance. This is a critical opportunity to help fulfill our basic responsibility to keep children from going hungry," said Chairman Scott.

The *Healthy Meals, Healthy Kids Act* will help address both pre-existing inequities as well as food insecurity spurred by the pandemic. Specifically, the legislation will:

- Expand access to school meals,
- Preserve the future of school meal programs,
- Modernize the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC),
- Address food insecurity during the summer,
- Improve school meal capacity and sustainability, and
- Strengthen the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP).

## FRAC Hails Introduction of Child Nutrition Reauthorization Bill Designed to Strengthen School Meals, WIC, Child Care Food, and Other Child Nutrition Programs

FRAC commends Congress for including provisions that ensure children have access to the nutrition they need year-round. Among many provisions, the Act would

- dramatically increase children's access to free school meals by expanding community eligibility which would allow more high-need schools to offer free meals to all students at no charge and expand direct (automatic) certification to include Medicaid;
- provide critical protections for children and families with unpaid school meal fees and require school districts to take steps to determine if families who are accruing school lunch debt are eligible for free or reduced-price meals;
- significantly expand access to summer meals and create a nationwide Summer EBT program, a complementary approach that would help close the summer hunger gap;
- give the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) waiver authority during federally declared emergencies;
- allow for an additional reimbursable meal for children in a full day of care, helping to provide the full complement of meals young children need to grow and thrive;
- modernize the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) by requiring WIC clinics to offer services over the phone and via video options and allow remote benefit issuance;
- extend WIC benefits to children up to 6 years old, and extend certification periods to two years for infants, children, and postpartum individuals; and
- create a pilot program to allow Tribal governments to express their inherent sovereignty in the space of food and agriculture by administering the child nutrition programs.

These critical investments will help end childhood hunger, improve health, and support academic achievement and child development. FRAC enthusiastically supports this plan and urges the House Education and Labor Committee to quickly pass the bill so it can move to the House floor.

Hungry children can't wait.

Dear John Katko,

On July 20, 2022, the House Education and Labor Committee proposed the Healthy Meals, Healthy Kids Section-by-Section H.R. 8450.

The bill, if approved, would extend WIC to aged 6. This would allow low-income parents to have extra money to purchase milk. cheese, eggs, juice, fruits, vegetables, and cereal to keep all their preschool children on a healthy diet until kindergarten.

The children and youth of Palmyra have been able to receive a free lunch prepared by the ARC in Newark. This past summer 30 lunches were passed out each Monday-Thursday for 6 weeks in the summer. As there are 10 weeks during the summer, I would like that program increased to the full 10 weeks.

Although I believe all children should eat a nutritious lunch, there are certainly families that can afford to pay for their children's lunches. But I also know there are many families that cannot give their children a nutritious lunch I support getting lunches to low-income children both in the schools and childcare facilities.

Ending Balance – 783.12/ 1 rent for 1 adult/ designated for Fire Victims \$115

**Weekend Wellness update** – This year same as in the past. Foodlink will deliver boxes with 8 bags/box. The cost is up to \$8.50/bag and will charge only \$3/bag.

Beginning Balance - \$10,835.32/ No deposits/ checks written for \$980

Ending Balance \$9,855.32/ No bags delivered in September.

Today is the first delivery, and 80 bags will be delivered to the school.

**Next year** Foodlink will continue to do bags, but will charge full price, which makes it impossible to fund. Foodlink supports setting up a food pantry at the school, and school has no space and is resistant to this idea. Foodlink says stigma of Food Pantry will keep parents away from delivering items to the food pantry. We will continue to discuss what will be best for Pal-Mac families and develop a plan.

Reverse Advent Calendar – beginning November 27 – calendar will be put in newsletter and in bulletins during Advent. Calendar will be shared with Zion, Reformed, Community and Cross Creek churches.


