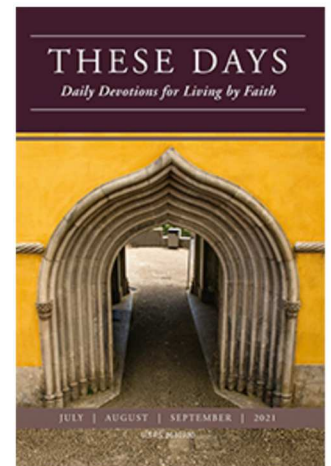

Food Pantry update

1. Report by Ruth – In April 2021, Income \$9,564.83 expenses \$4,327.93, and Total Funds on Hand - \$62,816.64
2. 2nd quarter **2021** – 176 adults, 92 children, 112 households, 45 seniors, total 313
3. 2nd quarter **2020** – 190 adults, 88 children, 154 households, 80 seniors, total 358

4. A larger sign may be helpful as several people have not known there is a food pantry in Palmyra.
5. Macedon Cupboard by the Library has non-perishable foods that individuals and families can take. Irene will bring to Session. Can we build one a similar cupboard for those in need of food on WPC grounds? Another site suggested was Community Center.
6. Personal care items, household cleaning products are always needed.

Community Garden update

1. Volunteers – Phil, Irene, and Peter. Rena planted and watered, Norm planted.
2. Food pantries – in Palmyra and in Macedon have received vegetables. Families like cherry tomatoes, peppers, and green beans. Families aren't taking a lot of tomatoes or squash. Ruth and Don have taken vegetables to both pantries.
3. Ruth and Sally will take vegetables to Tow Path Towers, if they can get someone to let them in.
4. Dick True says we need younger volunteers. The Trues have been happy with our using their garden. Mrs. True has picked some cherry tomatoes and peppers as they needed picking between Sunday when Phil picked and Friday when Irene and Peter picked.

Good Neighbor Fund Update

Beginning Balance \$1,281.73/ Donation \$25/ Checks written \$600/ Ending Balance \$706.73.
Assistance provided- security deposit for adult and child.

Weekend Wellness update –

Beginning and Ending Balance - \$9,670.32 In 2020-2021 school year 2,651 bags.

Each bag costs \$3 this school year up from \$2.50 in past years.

Ray and Terry have agreed to be another team to take bags to the schools, taking the place of Jan and Joan. Both the Lions and the Rotary would like to provide support to Weekend Wellness. Edie will put both groups into the calendar for the year.

Edie has contacted the schools, and Food Link. She will get clarity on Free and Reduced Lunch at 50%. How many will get weekend wellness?

Boxes will arrive from Foodlink with 8 bags per box. The boxes will be sealed. Edie didn't know about weight of boxes. Edie is planning to open one box per school to put # of allergy bags into and will mark the boxes for the schools.

Edie will suggest again that 3rd and 4th graders who receive bags will be reminded to come to the social worker or counselor every week. Some were forgetful and took several bags the weeks they remembered to go.

Rotary has \$5,000 grant for Weekend Wellness, and it will be available as it has no expiration date.

Family Promise update:

Night without a Bed event –

Apartments are being sought in Lyons so families will be closer to the Day Center for help and guidance to find an apartment, a job, and county programs. Host congregations will also be able to host a little, maybe a dinner or two together with dinner hosts and families at the Day Center.

WPC has hosted 4 weeks this calendar year. We will sign up for 4 weeks in 2022. We were able to do 3 of those weeks in the summer which worked out well for CTNS and for apartments in Savannah.

Property Ministry Team - Minutes

Items reviewed/discussed:

- Assisting CTNS with preparations for school start:
 - Plan is to finish wall section removal and install trim week ending September 4th.
 - Gary, with some assistance, will clean and then install AC units in classrooms.
 - Phil is looking into mirror options to assist CTNS staff with full view of expanded classroom.
 - Canopy in parking lot will stay up for the first couple weeks per recommendation from Phil.
- Additional Fall/Winter preparations for WPC:
 - Will be calling Crossfield mid to late September to check West Sanctuary furnace that was not blowing hot air at the end of last winter.
- Refrigerator temperature control.
 - Gary ran some tests and was unable to stabilize the temperature so he will be calling the service company listed on the fridge (They are still in business and were ready to send someone out when Gary first called)
- Approved plan to rent lift from Blazey to inspect, clean, and repair gutters around church. Expect ½ to 1 day rental.
- Some areas of the church need deeper cleaning than Larry can provide at this time due to his family schedule. Team looking into possible cleaning services that we can try out for a couple of these areas to verify the cost versus quality of the service. Might help us decide if service is a possible option instead of hiring a sexton.
- Camera for organist likely needs replacement. Connection between monitor and camera was lost 8/22. Slight pressure on the camera case front reconnected the units. If remains unstable, may need to replace. James working with Jack Moak on possible replacement options.
- Steve and Gary have acquired some LED replacement bulbs to fit in existing fixtures. Requires some minor rewiring of fixture but should reduce energy consumption and last considerably longer than existing bulbs. First fixture is just outside kitchen door. Approved plan to purchase enough to completely convert hallway as a larger scale test of lights that are on the most. Would use up our store of existing fluorescent replacement bulbs elsewhere in the church and then start buying more LED replacements.
- James still investigating internet service options.
 - Plan to have options and associated costs by next Property Meeting.

 - Wall section removal has been completed. Currently there does not appear to be a need for mirrors.
- Refrigerator temperature control.
 - Gary ran some tests and was unable to stabilize the temperature so he will be calling the service company listed on the fridge.
- Gary and Phil made use of the lift from James Blazey & CO to clean gutters, repair/replace screens, and fix water overflow issues with the gutters. James Blazey & CO refused the payment for the rental \$225 rental fee since it was for use of the church.
- Have purchased enough LED replacement bulbs to move forward with replacing all fluorescent lights in the hallway on the first floor.
- Planning for second to third week of October to replace lightbulbs in sanctuary chandeliers. Will also do “winter closing” activities while up above sanctuary.
- So far, team has not been able to locate source of water that is causing paint damage on west Sanctuary ceiling. Will continue to search for cause and get it repaired.
- James to update page for church website. Will also be updating the Property Usage form and submitting to Session for approval. Both of these items will have input from Property Team members as well as the November front page Spire Article. Expect completion before October session meeting.
